SIGN #4 - Blind faith in the leader.



BIBLICAL TRAITS OF GOOD LEADERS A GOOD LEADER . . .

- ... does not grow weary of doing good (Gal. 6:9);
- . . . is self-controlled, respectable, not a drunkard, not violent or quarrelsome, not a lover of money (1 Tim. 3:2-3);
- ... does nothing from rivalry or conceit (Philippians 2:3);
- ... is a servant first (Mark 10:42);
- . . . seeks righteousness and justice (Prov. 21:3).

IMPORTANT QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF BEFORE VOTING

- 1. Does this candidate reflect my views on social justice, human rights, and human dignity, and have a voting record to support that?
- 2. Does my candidate model the biblical traits of a good leader?
- 3. Does my candidate display any of the traits of authoritarianism?
- 4. Have I considered all candidates from an unbiased perspective? Am I guarding against being swayed by disinformation and propaganda?
- 5. Are you considering the needs of all God's children as you vote?
